
#### The Servant Leader's

Jesus says, "Kingdom leadership doesn't climb ladders, it washes feet."




### Context: The Clash of Expectations

James and John came asking for **seats of glory**.

They were angling for thrones, not towels.

They wanted power without pain, crowns without the cross.





Let us be honest — the human desire for recognition, status, and elevation is universal.

Too many leaders today still seek these, not the cross, the towel, the water basin, or the kneeling position.

But Jesus says, "That's not how we roll in the Kingdom."





### **Jesus:** The Model Servant Leader

Let me lift up the ultimate example: Jesus, the Son of Man!
He had the highest rank in the universe but came down 42 generations.





#### Jesus: The Model Servant Leader

He touched lepers.

He welcomed children.

He broke bread with sinners.

In John 13, the King of kings wraps a towel around His waist, bends down, and washes the dirty feet of doubting, denying, betraying disciples!

What kind of leader does that?

A servant leader.

A king who kneels.
A Savior who serves.
And if the Son of God
can get low, what
excuse do we have?





Jesus' Model – Servanthood as Glory

Jesus was not anti-leader.

He was anti-pride.

He didn't come in a chariot;


He came on a donkey.

Jesus redefined greatness.






## EGW Insight – Leaders Are Not Appointed, They Are Anointed

going down.




#### Application: Leaders with Towel and Basin

#### A Call to WAD Leaders – We Serve to Lead, and Lead to Serve

And we must never forget that when the fire of mission burns low, the servant-leader fans the flame!
We lead because we serve, and serve because He first served us.



# Implication for WAD Leadership

WAD Impact 2025 a call to servant leadership! The reason churches moved, members rose, and souls were reached is not because we showed power—it's because we showed service.





# Implication for WAD Leadership

That is servant leadership. That is Christlike leadership. And if we're going to keep the momentum burning, we must lead not from the boardroom, but from the upper room — where leaders bend down and say, "How can I serve you?"





### The Model of the Master – He Gave His Life

Jesus didn't say He came to start a board. He said He came to give His life.

Real leaders don't cling to their lives—they lay them down.
He gave His life as a ransom—and I dare say, until you've given something that cost you, you haven't led in Christ's name.
